

Images of the six skyscrapers which could replace New Scotland Yard released



Images of the six skyscrapers which could replace New Scotland Yard if plans are approved tomorrow have been released.

Plans include 268 flats - ten of which will be classed as affordable housing - with the highest tower being 20 storeys high.

But developers have said they will give £10 million for affordable housing "elsewhere" in the city.

The towers include plans for a swimming pool for residents, a private gym and cinema as well as car parking spaces underground.

There will also be shops and offices on the lower levels.

New Scotland Yard has been used as the Met's headquarters since 1967 but is now being moved to Victoria Embankment which is expected to save £6 million a year in running costs.

The move, which is anticipated to cost up to £60 million, should be completed by summer this year.
